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### Brompton Quarter Brasserie

Laura Tennant visits a relaxed all-day brasserie in Knightsbridge

Close to Harrods in the heart of London's most expensive cut of prime real estate is a restaurant offering a welcome change to over-pricing, starched linen and miniature portions. No surprise then that on the day I visited with my Irish friend Claire, it was full of ladies who lunch heartily not faddily (and Claire bumped into no less than two school friends from the Ould Sod - now what are the chances?).

Sharing dishes (from £5.95) are delicious and generous; order 4 or 5 and you'll have plenty to nibble on. We chose avocado salad with cherry tomatoes, red onion and coriander; roasted aubergine with sesame oil; marinated chicken skewers with turmeric, garlic, paprika and coriander; chickpea fritters and cous cous salad - a mouth-watering feast which came with baskets of warm pitta bread. Fresh, seasonable and sustainable are chef Madjit Kouari's watchwords, while a strong Mediterranean influence adds robust flavour and colour.



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
